

ENYDCTA Year End Awards Program.

Overall Eligibility:

- Must be a member in good standing at the time scores are earned and submitted.
- All horses must be registered with ENYDCTA at the time scores are earned.
- Dates for eligible scores are on found on the entry form and in the Piaffe Flyer.
- Championships are limited to two consecutive years at the same level for a horse/rider combination. There is a one-year ineligibility at that level following the second championship.

What to Submit With Your Nomination Form:

- Any of the following are acceptable documentation of scores:
- Printout from the USDF website with the scores you would like to use highlighted.
- Dressage test copies - must show the level, score, show name and judge's signature.
- Print out from the USEA website showing the official record for the nominee.
- Printout from the website for the host organization showing the official record for the nominee.
- Print out from the event, signed by the secretary or organizer.
- Listing of event(s) with date(s), organizer, area and secretary's name and contact info for verification.

USEF Recognized Dressage Shows:

- ❖ You may nominate at two levels with the same horse.
- ❖ You may nominate at the same level with different horses.
- ❖ High Point 1st – 8th place. May be split Open/AA/JrYr if warranted.
- ❖ Placing is determined by the average of the highest four scores for each nominee.
- ❖ Scores must be from at least two different show and two different judges.
- ❖ Two of the scores must be from the highest test of the level.
- ❖ Scores must be 55% or higher.
- ❖ No eventing dressage scores or "opportunity classes."

Dressage Schooling Shows:

- ◆ Eligible levels are Intro through Second level.
- ◆ Rider must be an amateur as defined by US Equestrian guidelines.
- ◆ Rider can compete for this award at more than one level.
- ◆ High Point 1st – 8th place. May be split AA/JrYr if warranted.
- ◆ All scores submitted must be from at least an "L" judge in order to qualify.
- ◆ Placing is determined by the average of the highest four scores for each nominee.
- ◆ Scores must be from at least two different shows and two different judges.
- ◆ "Opportunity Class" scores are also acceptable for this award.
- ◆ Scores from at least two different tests of the level must be submitted.
- ◆ It is not required to ride the highest test of the level.
- ◆ Scores must be 55% or higher.
- ◆ No eventing dressage scores.

USEF Recognized Eventing Shows:

- ◇ Beginner Novice through Advanced Low Point
- ◇ All eventing awards recognize the lowest penalty point horse/rider combination.
- ◇ You may nominate at two levels at the same time with the same horse/rider combination.
- ◇ You may nominate at the same level with more than one horse.
- ◇ The three lowest penalty points will be averaged to determine the placing for each nominee.
- ◇ High Point 1st-8th place. May be split by level and/or Open/AA/JrYr if warranted.
- ◇ Riders may submit as many scores as they wish, but only the lowest three will be averaged.

Eventing Schooling Shows:

- Eligible levels are two-phase through training.
- Three tests must be submitted showing both the dressage score and stadium, and if applicable, cross-country penalties.
- Scores for eventing must have the show secretaries' signature confirming final score, name and date of show or nominee must provide a copy of the show's final results.

Masters Award:

- Rider must be 50 years of age or older.
- Dressage: The top four scores can be submitted from both recognized and schooling shows. A single championship is given to the highest scoring horse/rider combination nominated.
- Eventing: The lowest three scores can be submitted from both recognized and schooling events. A single championship is given to the lowest scoring horse/rider combination nominated, with no restrictions as to level.

Rider Achievement Award:

- Scores received from multiple horses may be submitted, as long as each horse is registered with ENYDCTA at the time the score is earned.
- Scores from several different competitive years may be used, as long as the nominee was a member in good standing at the time the score was earned.
- All scores submitted must be from at least an "L" judge in order to qualify.
- The medallion can only be earned once per rider per level.
- You may apply for more than one level at any time and you may apply in both dressage and eventing.
- You cannot however, use eventing dressage scores toward the dressage achievement awards.

Dressage Achievement Awards:

- Scores must be from at least three different shows and three different judges.
- Medallions may be earned at each level, but not combined.
- White Medallion (Training Level): Five scores of 63% or higher.
- Yellow Medallion (1st, 2nd and 3rd Levels): Five scores of 60% or higher.
- Red Medallion (4th Level): Five scores of 58% or higher.
- Blue Medallion (Prix St. Georges & Intermediaire I): Five scores of 55% or higher.
- Gold Medallion (Intermediaire II & Grand Prix): Five scores of 55% or higher.

Eventing Achievement Awards:

- Pink Medallion: Completion of four different two-phase tests.
- White Medallion (Beginner Novice and Novice Level): Completion of three horse trials at the beginner novice or novice level. Medallion can be earned at each level, but not combined.
- Yellow Medallion (Training Level): Placing 1st-10th in three different training level horse trials.
- Red Medallion: (Preliminary Level): Placing 1st-10th in three preliminary level horse trials, two-day or three-day competitions.
- Blue Medallion (Intermediate & Advanced Levels): Placing 1st-10th in any three competitions at both levels. This includes horse trials, two-day and three-day competitions.

The Andipyr Memorial Trophy:

This trophy was established in 2005 by a friend of Barbara Sanford, in memory of Barb's horse, Andipyr. Andipyr was the dream horse Barb had always hoped to find. Tragically, Andipyr's life was cut short by colic. This memorial is given to recognize other talented horses, no matter their age, who are beginning their dressage careers.

This is a dressage trophy with the qualifications being:

- The horse can only have competed at the Walk/Trot level with the nominee, no higher. Rider can be of any level, amateur or professional.
- Have received a minimum of four scores of 59% or greater from at least two different shows.
- The sponsor of the trophy will determine the trophy and/or prize to be given.
